Reading with your child in Reception






Some questions to ask your child whilst reading together:

2. Look at the front cover. What could the book be about?
3. What might happen in the story?
4. Who are the characters in the story?
5. How can you read an unfamiliar word? Can you sound talk and then blend?
6. What is happening here?
7. What do you think will happen next?
8. How do you think the story might end?
9. Who is your favourite character? Why?
10. What does _____ mean? (To check understanding of a word)
11. What was your favourite part? Why?
12. Which character did you like the best? Why?
